Rimersburg Borough Council Meeting

Call to Order

The Aug. 04, 2025 regularly scheduled meeting of the Rimersburg Borough Council was called to order by Council Vice-President, Mark at 6:59 p.m. with all present standing for the Pledge of Allegiance and a prayer led by Mark.

Persons to Be Heard

Council reviewed the water report. Lost water is down significantly to 654,000 gallons, the lowest since July 2024. Dylan informed Council of 1 of the 2 pumps breaking down at the water pump station and subsequent repair, replacement of motor.

Dylan informed Council that Boro. Maint. installed curbing on corner of Craig and Broad St. after assessment that resident's request had merit. They will handle the small cold patch projects on the Streets Committee's list in coming weeks.

3 piece system for sewer locator = \$14,000. "Rigid" is the brand in this quote and is the model and equipment that the engineer used, in which Council was interested. Council is interested in seeing a couple of other quotes for comparison. Constable Bob reviewed the 2025/07 police report. Notice was sent to Burns' regarding sidewalk and notice personally served to 141 Sloan St. regarding garbage. Informative discussion ensued regarding ordinance enforcement process, possibilities; judge decisions and payment plans causing enforcement issues at times. Mayor agreed to speak with the judge about repeat offenders and lack of action on their part to rectify issues, willingness to simply pay fines and make meager payment arrangements.

Approval of Minutes

The July 21, 2025 minutes were read and approved by a motion from J. B., second by Karina, and a unanimous vote.

Financial

J. B. made a motion to pay the bills which received a second from Anita and a unanimous vote in favor.

Personnel Committee:

A. J. B. motion, Roger seconded, carried to move into Executive Session for Personnel reasons at 7:07 p.m. Motion, second, carried to end Executive Session at 7:10 p.m.

B. 2 Boro. Maint. positions available. Several resumes and applications have been received. Dylan has reviewed some of those sent and will contact Personnel with his recommendations.

Building Committee:

- A. Regarding Community Bldg. roof leak, Mark has not heard from initial contractor. He has contacted another rubber roofing contractor who says once starts, should only take about 15-20 minutes to complete. Council consensus in favor.
- B. J. B. motion, Karina second, carried to allow SCC Little League to use the Community Bldg. Basement for batting cages.
- C. Borough Maintenance checked in with repairman to see if he has repaired the 2 furnaces in the Community Bldg. and he has not yet fixed the furnaces, was going to wait until cold weather. He has been instructed to fix immediately.

Streets Committee:

- A. Dylan recommends Chestnut as priority for paving projects if has settled enough since is not wearing well. There is a large crack down the center that was not sealed by TerraWorks. Council consensus to reach out to Kyle/ EADS to see if has been long enough to top Chestnut and to get estimates for all suggested areas from PENNDOT as separate segments in case choices are necessary.

Unfinished Business

- A. 1 Rimersburg Borough RBMA seat remains vacant since 04/21/2025. The Municipal Authority has not had a meeting since Council's meeting 2 weeks ago.
- B. Regarding SCC Little League's lease agreement with owners of Diamond Garden Apartments to review as sample for playground, Borough Office to contact Chad Shirey to ask for copy to be emailed to Borough Office for consideration and possibly ask solicitor to draft.

Correspondence

Information received via mail and email about several trainings available to Council, Authority, and staff including one free Cyber Security Training in Cook Forest. Mileage would be \$61.80 reimbursement total round trip per person driving; available in budget for council and staff.

New Business

- A. Casino establishments in town – consensus 07/21/2025 mtg. have solicitor draft tax ordinance. No progress at this time.
- B. Donation of 13 plastic 8-foot long folding tables was received from Union School District per emails 2025-07-25.
