Call to Order

The June 02, 2025 regularly scheduled meeting of the Rimersburg Borough Council was called to order by Council Vice-President, Mark at 7:02 p.m. with all present standing for the Pledge of Allegiance and a prayer led by Mark.

Persons to Be Heard

Council reviewed the water report. Water loss was up to just over 1,000,000 gallons.

Chief reviewed the 2025/05 police report. A part-time officer will be joining the force in 2 weeks. Waiting for 2 cadets to pass agility portion of test to be accepted into the academy. **Motion made by J. B., seconded by Pam to approve 08/10/2025 closing of Borough streets for Southern Clarion County Community Days and car show. The motion carried with a unanimous vote in favor.** Vendors will not be charged this year; first come, first serve. Have other plans to make funds that they would lose from that and more. Fund raisers are going well. Fishing event with the sportsman's club doubled in size.

Approval of Minutes

The May 05, 2025 minutes were read and approved by a motion from J. B., second by Mark, and a unanimous vote.

Financial

J. B. made a motion to pay the bills which received a second from Pam and a unanimous vote in favor.

1 CD matured at the end of April and 2 CDs matured at the end of May. All gains will be transferred to appropriate municipal checking accounts and principle re-invested per previously determined cycle. Rep. provided recommendations and rates per an email sent to the Borough office and Council earlier in the day.

Motion Anita, second J. B., carried in favor of entering agreement w/ Atty. Marshall as LGUDA rep. (\$15,000 pd. w/ WWTP Project funds).

Motion Roger, second Pam, carried in favor of adopting Ordinance 02-2025 for LGUDA for the WWTP (Waste Water Treatment Plant) Upgrade Project loan \$2,284,143.

Motion J. B., second Anita, carried to approve a check for \$121.38 made payable to the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania" for the LGUDA filing fee.

Motion Roger, second Anita, carried in favor adopting Fifth Addendum to Lease Agreement w/ RBMA extending term to 12/31/2060 as proposed previous meeting.

Building Committee:

- A. Community Bldg. leaks fixed = \$4,000.00 (\$4000.00 in 2025 budget for Comm. Bldg.
- B. The 2 furnaces were noticed to not be working properly after inadequate heat on election day. A temporary fix has been employed for roughly \$100.00. Estimated cost to repair both furnaces is roughly \$1,000.00. J. B. motion, Pam second, unanimous vote in favor to have Jack Hetrick repair Community Bldg. furnaces for the estimated cost of \$1,000.00.

Streets Committee: Various places were discussed for possible paving projects including a storm drain area near UCC Church. J. B., Roger, Mark to speak with Dylan to get PENNDOT rep. help to determine appropriate bid process. Committee members expressed interest in installing requested curbing and specifying some other areas for seal coating.

Roger informed Council about failing storm drains. There is a Borough portion of 160'+ put in 1962 from Rt. 68 toward Monterey Rd. before his portion. It is in the path of the Monterey Road Waterline Project. He will have another 200ft after that to replace himself.
